- If writing practice is sent home, please try to practice a little bit of it with your child every day.
 - This does not need to be enforced, merely encouraged.
 - Please send back what is completed to school in your child's take-home folder.
- Play tic-tac-toe with your child students are still acquiring the skill/practice of trying to outsmart the
 other player and get "three in a row."

Things you can do to help your child make the most of *this* week:

- Practice the sound for the letter L Love, Laugh, Lamb, Lion, Lamp
- Practice counting by 2's
- Go out for a walk
 - o Talk about the kinds of trees you see
 - o Talk about what season it is and how the leaves and flowers are beginning to bloom
- Practice identifying your right and left.
- Talk about lying and why it is harmful to ourselves and others.
- Discuss the importance of truth, as the character in *The Empty Pot* learned about it also.
